





The Spirit of an "Almost Dead Dog"

She smelled horrible with long matted fur full of feces, long toe nails, a skin condition, the few teeth she had were painfully rotten and she had the worst ear infection I had ever seen. All of this, and I have not even mentioned that she was deaf, almost blind and mammary tumors so large they were dragging on the ground. (Mammary tumors are common in dogs not spayed).

Even in her awful condition, Christie Kang, Capital Area Humane Officer, could tell there was something special about her. The Humane Society called us for assistance. Sissy was near death but they could not bear the thought of her never knowing love or living her final days in pain. Columbus Dog Connection provided the much needed surgery for the mammary tumors. She was then placed in my home to live out her life.

After the surgery, one by one, Columbus Dog Connection provided relief for one ailment after another until Sissy was able to smile again. You may not believe me, but she smiled every day. We never expected her to live long. Maybe a few weeks or a few months. People would commonly ask me how Sissy was doing. They would always be curious to see if she had passed away yet.

I always said, cautiously, that Sissy was doing very well but any day may be her last. During her time with me, she lived through 2 Christmas'. She affectionately became known as "Almost dead dog Sissy". You may think this sounds like a shocking name to call an elderly dog so close to the end. It was truly a term of endearment. Everyone would be surprised and excited when I would give updates that "Almost Dead Dog" was doing great! She defied the odds because we were willing and able to put the time and love into her care.

Almost Dead Dog Sissy always walked like a drunken sailor because her equilibrium was off due to the severe ear infections. Her tongue would hang out of the side of her mouth because she didn't have any teeth. I think this made her even more beautiful! You can see her smiling in the picture.
